


When Topsy and Tim looked out of the window for the first time on Tuesday morning, they saw a big digger parked at the end of the garden next door.

The digger had already dug a large, neat, square hole at the end of Mr Fen's garden.




When Eric saw Topsy and Tim he called to them, "Hello, twins! Do you think your mum would give us some hot water to make our coffee?"

Mummy poured hot water into the flasks, and they were full of steaming coffee.








Topsy and Tim wanted to help Mummy take the coffee out to the builders, but Eric came to the back door to fetch it. "Come on, twins," he said.
